What a wonderful summer!





#### 7TH ANNUAL LOPEZ CUP YACHT RACE

The 7th Annual Lopez Cup Yacht Race was help on August 19th. The race, as traditionally held, was a staggered start race with the handicaps pre-figured for an 8.6 mile course. The slowest boats start first and the faster boats next according to their Performance Handicap Rating. The first boat to start was David Bill's Ranger 26 at 1 pm-21 minutes-04 seconds. The last was **Speedster**, a Melges 24, 17 minutes later.

Winds at the start of the race were very light and the boats struggled up to the Coast Guard turning buoy west of Cattle Pass. The wind increased after the mark rounding and all the boats in the race were able to finish before the time limit.

The finish was the closest in the seven-year history of the race with Speedster

catching and passing the Raven 24 and the Pyramid 660 shortly before the finish line, winning the race by a mere 23 seconds.


